Puerto Rico: Mission Update



Plans for our mission to Puerto Rico continue to move forward. We are in active discussions with the Chief Medical Officer of Global Health Initiative, Dr. David Watson. He and his team are in the process of assessing needs in Puerto Rico and establishing a base of operations in Buen Samaratino Hospital in Aguadilla Pueblo, Aguadilla. As you can see from the marker, this is located in the northwest corner of the island. Global Health Initiative is the mission component of Centura Health. They began planning a mission for long-term assistance to Puerto approximately 9 months ago, prior to the disaster incurred by Hurricane Maria. GHI has all paperwork completed and has been given permission by the Ministry of Health to locate their mission in Buen Samaratino. Dr. Watson indicated that they look for collaborators to provide various services such as medical, mental health. translators, construction, clean-up, and numerous other skilled labor.

Pax Christi Little Rock will provide GHI with a detailed report of what we can provide to the mission and the various skills of the individuals who will be involved.

According to Dr. Watson, he and his advance team will visit Buen Samaratino in October, 2018. At this point, their first full mission trip is scheduled for Spring, 2019. Dr. Watson stated that it takes such a long period of time to set up the mission as there are four "Must Have's" that need to be in place:

- 1. Full assessment of need
- 2. Engaged partner agreements
- 3. Collaboration with Ministry of Health
- 4. Assurance of Safe Environment

Pax Christi continues to dialog with individuals on the GHI team. Additionally, we are exploring possible connections with VOAD and a Methodist group already on the ground in PR.

Pilgrimage for Peace, 2018, organized by a coalition of ecumenical faith and community organizations, was held on **Sunday, April 8 at 2:00 PM**. Walkers gathered in the circle outside of **Heifer International Village**, 1 World Avenue, Little Rock. They walked past the Clinton Presidential Library and the River Market, crossed the Junction Bridge and over to the **Beacon of Peace and Hope** at 120 Riverfront Drive, NLR. Pax Christi members were among the pilgrims.

A Remembrance Service to "mourn the violence committed in our community, nation, and world, and to walk together as active peacemakers" was held, consisting of groups of young people saying prayers, providing reflections from literature and scripture, and singing songs related to peace. Finally, the names of all the victims of homicide in Pulaski County over the past year were read. Emily VanEcko, a student at Mt. More Corks Shipped to Soles4Souls





Pax Christi Little Rock held it's first publicly announced LGBTQ support group meeting entitled Welcome Home: An Invitation from the Catholic Church to It's LGBT Brothers and **Sisters** on Thursday, March 22. Twenty people were in attendance and the discussion of issues relevant to individuals who identify as LGBT, family members, and parishioners was edifying. Each person had an opportunity to introduce themselves and talk about what motivated them to come to the group. Discussion of issues around perceptions of the Church as well as perceptions of the LGBT community was conducted with sincerity, compassion and respect across the board. All members indicated that they wanted to continue the group discussion on a monthly basis, and it was determined that we would meet the third Thursday of the month at 7 pm in Fitzgerald Hall.
