John Coffin and Dr. Donnal Walter present the Alternatives to Violence Project

On Thursday, September 18 at 6:30 pm. Dr. Donnal 1 Walter John and Coffin will share their vision of The Alternatives to Violence Project (AVP), a series of workshops

initially designed to empower individuals in prison to overcome their violent tendencies. The workshops use the shared life experiences of both participants and facilitators to examine how injustice, prejudice, frustration and anger can lead to aggressive behavior and violence. They explore our innate power to respond in new and creative ways.

Since 2016, the Arkansas Coalition for Peace and Justice (ACPJ) has been involved with the Friends Meeting of Little Rock (Quakers) in using the AVP program for Adult inmates at Tucker Prison. These programs emphasize affirmation, communication, community and working together without coercion, recognizing the potential we all have to grow and develop positive relationships. The project utilizes the same approach taken by Mahatma Gandhi, Martin Luther King, Jr., and others in the peace

and social justice movement.

At this time, ACPJ intends to begin an AVP community program that will appeal to adults in central Arkansas.

will include the training of individuals in the community to assist in a prison or community program or a program component designed for school aged children.

AVP is one of the most powerful, empowering anti-bullying programs available. The principle of learning from shared experiences has been effective in schools across the country.

In August, Settled Souls moved three individuals into homes of their own in Little Rock.



On August 16, Mike and the CTK Settled Souls team helped settle in Eddie. Eddie had a series of unfortunate events happen in his life that contributed to him be-

coming homeless. However, he has

taken many steps to get back on his feet. He now has a place of his own and is working full-time and doing great! Lee Bass provided the pantry box food and helped with the move.





On August 25, Settled Souls settled Robert into his apartment home. When Robert was in Califor-

nia, family challenges and the loss of a job during the pandemic contributed to his homelessness. Robert moved to Arkansas from California for a fresh start and is now in the process of getting back on his feet. He is so grateful for the help he has received from organizations in

Little Rock such as Jericho Way, Canvas Church and Settled Souls. Robert said that he was amazed how quickly his apartment could feel more like home. Lee and Agnes Bass supplied the food and helped with the move.





On August 30, the CTK Settled Souls team helped Xavier settle into his new home. Xavier had been homeless for six months due to housing challenges. He was very grateful for the help with home

goods, especially for the furniture and accessories in his bedroom. Mary Hunt provided the Pax Christi pantry start-up and also helped in the move.

PCLR Joins Peace Partners in Activities Highlighting Peace Week 2022: September 18-25

Since that time, multiple individuals and agencies have come together in a series of summits to support those leaving prison in having "new prospects, hope and second chances." Now, in several cities across Arkansas, the collaboration of agencies designed and supported by Restore Hope has doubled the foster care reunification rate and opened up job opportunities for those previously

incarcerated. Paul Chapman, Executive Director of Restore Hope, gave the key note address, providing statistics that point to the success of Restore Hope programs.

husband and several children. This family has been severely affected by the recent floods. They have no electricity, food is limited and their children are quite ill and need medical care. Evidently, it costs a great deal of money to get treatment where they live and the family has no money. The Pax Christi LR board took up a collection among themselves and was able to wire \$500 with the help of Dr. Ali Kahn to this family to help these children. It is imperative that we reach across borders to provide sustenance to others. Whether we are aware of it or not, we all need one another. Providing for the needs of another is a clear path to justice and ultimate peace.

It should be noted that this was far and away the most significant amount of money that Pax Christi has ever raised at one of these events.
