Gun Violence In America

Helping the Victims



On Thursday May 16 Mr Darlynton Adegor, the Victim Services Program Manager for the Little Rock-based Center for Healing Hearts and Spirits (CHHS), presented an overview of the Center's

outreach healing program for victims of gun violence in Arkansas. The Victim Services Program of the CHHS provides comprehensive victim's services, including court advocacy, crisis counseling, emergency room assistance, and support groups to underserved victims of crimes in Arkansas, Faulkner, Jefferson, Pulaski, and Saline Counties. Clients include non-English speaking victims of child abuse, general assault victims, homicide victims' survivors, domestic violence victims, senior 65 and older, and persons with disabilities The Victim Services Program was designed to assist crime victims and their affected families to improve the quality of victim's services delivery in high-crime, urban and rural areas in Arkansas.

Beating Guns into Plowshares

On Thursday June 20 PCLR was privileged to view a webinar from Pax Christi USA featuring **Mr. Shane Claiborne**, a prominent preacher, activist, and best-selling author! Shane described his many efforts in recent years to curb gun violence by promoting a reduction in firearms, getting guns off the streets. The data are striking:

- While only 5% of the world's population, Americans in the US own almost one-half the world's guns; there are more guns than people in the US
- America also has the world's most gun deaths—including homicide, suicide, and accidental gun deaths—at 105 per day or about 38,000 per year
- More Americans have died from guns in the US in the last fifty years than in all the wars in American history
- States with more guns have greater violence; states with greater gun controls have less violence
- A majority of Americans favor one or more measures to control access to guns yet Congress fails to act due to the inordinate power of the gun lobby

Shane's message to everyone: If Americans felt as strongly about the Sermon on the Mount as the Second Amendment and viewed reduction in gun violence an essential part of the pro-life agenda, we could make the world a safer place for all of us.



Shane has co-authored a book with Michael Martin detailing the frightening situation with guns in America entitled Beating Guns-Hope for People Who are Weary of Violence.

Third Speaker in Series on Human Trafficking

On April 18 Pax Christi Little Rock heard from a local FBI agent responsible for fighting human trafficking in Arkansas. Human trafficking is the illegal exploitation of a person. Anyone can be the victim of human trafficking, and it can occur in any U.S. community—cities, suburbs, and even rural areas. Here in the United States, both U.S. residents and foreign nationals are being bought and sold like modernday slaves. Traffickers use violence, manipulation, or false promises of well-paying jobs or romantic relationships to exploit victims. Victims are forced to work as prostitutes or take jobs as migrant, domestic, restaurant, or factory workers with little or no pay. Under the human trafficking program, the FBI investigates sex trafficking, labor trafficking, and domestic servitude. While FBI agents rely heavily on referrals from law enforcement agencies and non-government organizations, citizens can also help by calling the **National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline at 1-888-373-7888**.
